V. Strategize the Vision — The competency of the Workers

Rick Warren once said, "Those that fail to plan, plan to fail." Strategy is a key component of vision fulfillment but little time is spent on discussing strategy in many Spirit-filled churches. Many say, "We are to be led by the Spirit." We need the Spirit, but we also need strategy! The Bible admonishes has much to say about planning.

Habakkuk 2:2, "Write down the revelation and make it plain on tablets so that a herald may run with it.

Deut. 27:8, "And you shall <u>write very clearly</u> all the words of this law on these stones you have set up."

Isaiah 8:1, "The Lord said to me, "Take a large scroll and write on it with an ordinary pen"

Proverbs 13:16, "Wise people think before they act."

A. Strategy defined

- 1. "A careful plan or method."
- 2. "The art of devising a <u>well thought process</u> to obtain a specific goal."

God is a God of strategy. You see it in creation, the unfolding of His purposes, the development of tabernacles and temples, to taking of cities and nations, to the architecture of heaven. God is strategic!

B. Practical Steps to Vision Strategy (MOVE SLOWLY!)

Your Church leadership has spent a great deal of time to develop a specific structure and strategy for your church's existence. Today we will look at the vision and see how the vision is worked out within the ranks of the church teams, ministries, programs and events.

- 1. Understand your role in the organization.
 - a. Define your responsibilities. (title and function).







b. Develop a method of time management .If you don't have a time management system you will never build a great church. #PDA, Day Timer, Notepad

c. Develop a personal action plan. – Whether a Senior Pastor, Leader, or support staff.

#I do annual plan, monthly review, weekly planning.

#QUESTION - How many use action plans? What do they look like?

2. Understand the goals of the organization.

Q – People are down on what they are not up on.

- a. What are you trying to accomplish? Can you define it?
- b. When are you trying to accomplish them by?
- c. How will you accomplish them?
- d. Do they align and support the house vision?
- e. Do they show up in your weekly activity?
- f. Are they put into your weekly schedule? #Time is one of the most precious commodities
- 3. Define the Organizational structure #Discuss more later wkshp
 - a. What positions are needed to fulfill the vision?
 - b. What are the duties of those positions? (job descriptions)
 - c. Develop an organizational structure to define positions and duties. (see example below)



- 4. Recruit your Team Players
 - Define the personnel criteria for each position. #5 c's, Character, commitment, competency, compatibility and capacity.
 - b. Confirm existing leaders, many may be in place.
 - Develop a list of potential leaders. (Each spot)

- Write down goals for each area.

d. Make time each week to meet with them.

5. Activate your Team

- Make a spreadsheet or page for every position or department. #CBC, Core and Individuals
- b. Write down goals for each area (see example list).#QUESTION How might this work for you?

6. Lead your Team

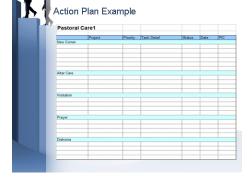
- a. Develop a meeting schedule for teams (Elder, Pastors, Dept., etc.)
- b. Develop a meeting schedule for individuals (Direct reports)

#QUESTION - Why would this be important?

c. Develop a meeting strategy for other leaders and their teams that you may oversee.(Make sure happening throughout organization)

d. Develop a folder for each meeting (team and individual).#Paper or PDA, my Blackberry#QUESTION – What would be the importance of this?

- e. Determine meeting strategy and content (individuals).
 - i. Relationship
 - ii. Review
 - iii. Projects and discussion
 - iv. Setting goals
